



Gender Distribution







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Ethnicity





Age ranges from Steuben County's Community Health Needs Survey respondents
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
Length of Time Living in Steuben County



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
Primary Language Spoken



Have Primary Care Physician



Over crowded, old, and at the time, only one offered care for memory care. We chose a facility in Kendallville, which was not convenient, but the best option that met our needs. Please consider this as we see a great need for this in Angola.

This is long overdue. The hospital is not equipped to even provide emergency in-house dialysis if needed - causing patients to be transferred to FW if they are a dialysis patient. Please take this into consideration. Star Transport is great for local transport - but is not cost effective for travel to other towns - for

example for dialysis treatments, cancer treatments (that aren't available at our Cancer Center) and appointments with specialists not in residence at Cameron. It would be nice if the hospital could offer transport at least to other Parkview hospitals, dialysis center etc. Perhaps insurance would cover it for many - Star is not covered by some insurance. This is a major concern for our elderly community members and those struggling with debilitating diseases. On a side note - I wonder why Cameron Lab is a "separate entity." Our insurance is good thru the hospital, our family doctor et. but we have to go to Lagrange, Noble, Dekalb or FW to get our labs covered? There seems to be a lot of confusion about whether Cameron is Parkview affiliated - if it is - it ALL should be including the lab. That all said - The Cancer Center is a God Send! It was very needed in our area and is a real blessing to many. Cameron also has some wonderful family doctors and ER doctors and staff. I think the addition of more staff specialists would be a definite benefit. I realize Cameron is somewhat limited in the services it can offer, but for those it can - I have found it to be an excellent small town hospital!

75. Everyone complains; next person praises.
76. I think it is a great disservice that we ended our Home Health Care program. With the difficulty we have obtaining HHC services from other companies that offer VERY limited services (little to no therapy) it feels like we are sending Cameron patients home to intermittent HHC services at best especially when we have a TCU program and limited follow through care when they are discharged. It feels like we have a gap in care from Inpatient/TCU to outpatient therapy. We could help close this gap by having HHC services. This would help reduce hospitalization and the growing outpatient therapy schedule. We also have a growing number of Parkinson's patients in the community, and a Movement Disorders Neurologist would be an amazing contribution to our community. We have one neurologist that comes up a couple times a month, but this is definitely not enough. If we have a Movement Disorders Neurologist, I can guarantee their schedule would be filled quickly! There is NO movement disorders neurologist in the area as the only one in Fort Wayne just left the community. I know people from Michigan, Ohio and Fort Wayne would come to see a Movement Disorders Neurologist here at Cameron instead of having to drive to Ann Arbor, Cleveland Clinic or Indianapolis.
77. Mental health really needs more attention. This seems to be a big issue and the community.
78. The rising cost of healthcare is very concerning, as well as the cost of living overall, and with no signs of positive change in sight, this is likely to affect the health and well-being of more and more people. Not everyone has good employer health insurance, and not everyone can afford the cost of a healthcare plan for their family. More affordable options should be readily available. There have been multiple times when I have contacted the hospital or local doctors' surgery etc., and I am made to feel ashamed that I don't have health insurance due to the extortionate costs, and some staff have been quite rude! We should not have to worry about whether we can afford a doctor's appointment or a surgery, etc. and every person should be treated with the highest standard, despite our ability to pay or not! Also, the timeframes for booking appointments is becoming ridiculous. For example, a regular teeth cleaning appointment is scheduled out 11 months at one local dentist office, with some not even

taking on new patients. This is also becoming more prevalent with family doctors. A colonoscopy at the local hospital was scheduled out for 5 months the last time I tried to book one.

79. We are very lucky to have such an outstanding hospital in our community - They are friendly every time we enter the building. The cafe is also wonderful - We even go eat just on a date night as the food is so good - Other friends do this also. We sure were blessed with our retired Dr. Berry Miller - hope the care continues with the new staff. As a mother with several children in the medical field thank you for all you do for your patience and community.
80. Our community is full of healthcare options, I think we need better sharing of information based on the questions in this survey.
81. Nurse practitioners always sends to a specialist no matter how far away from Angola they are. Cameron ER needs improvement They have a habit of sending patients to Parkview and then patient has to find a way back to Cameron to get car. They send down they get you back
82. I do feel like healthcare in this area has improved so much in the last 5-10 years but as in everything there is always room for continued improvement. Would however love a class to help with Spanish education as a healthcare worker to better work with our increasing Spanish population.
83. Cameron needs to accept the ANTHEM that's offered via OBAMACARE. Its the best plan out there for Hoosiers!
84. Biggest challenge is for people to know all the resources that are available in the county, and how to help navigate it. Second biggest is for the things that ARE offered (or if/when they are offered), for people find the time to use them (activities with family, etc.).
85. Much improved but we could always do better.
